What is the Triangle Bird Count?

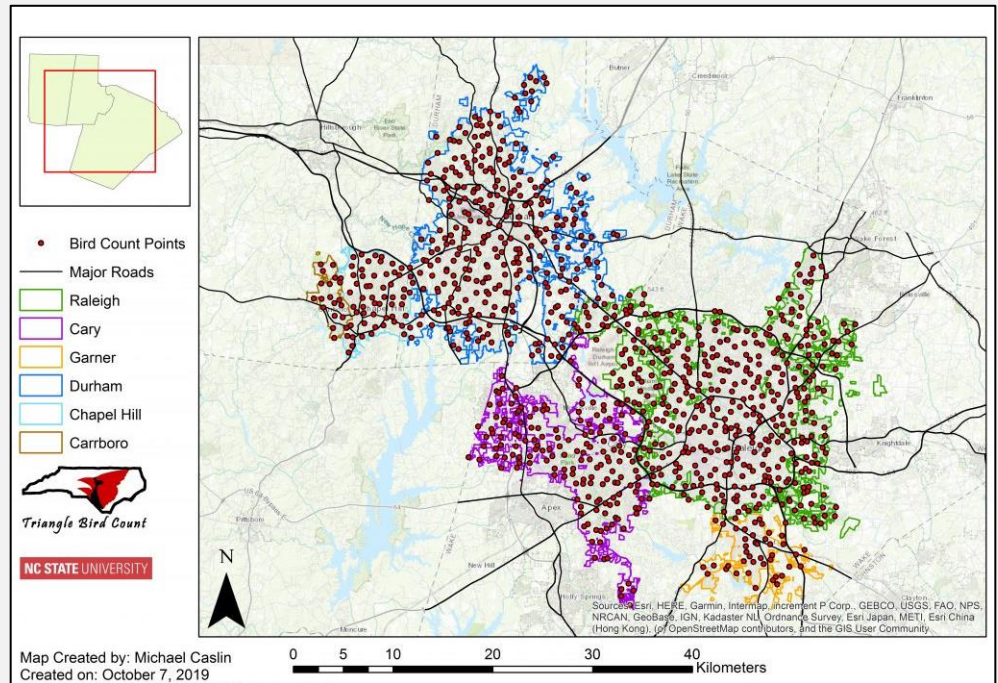
A citizen science project from the Lab of Reconciliation Ecology at the North Carolina State University.

When and where will it take place?

The Triangle Bird Count will take place between April 15 – May 31, 2024.

What will the data be used for?

The data will be used to monitor the abundance and diversity of bird species in and around the cities of North Carolina's "Research Triangle": Carrboro, Chapel Hill, Durham, Cary, Raleigh, and Garner.



Who can participate?

Beginner to experienced birders are welcomed to participate! Participation will require having the skills to identify most common urban birds by both sight and sound. There are bird ID quizzes on our website to help you improve your birding skills.
